

# Environmental improvements with Anfield Village

**RESIDENTS** in the Anfield Village area are being asked for their views on proposed environmental improvements.

Liverpool City Council, working in partnership with Your Housing Group, wants to create public spaces and selective garden extensions in the area following the demolition of a number of derelict homes.

The partners are proposing that on Gurnall and Hayfield, new green space is created close to houses with a range of sympathetic landscaping to meet local residents' wishes.

The green spaces would be maintained by Liverpool City Council. If residents are in favour of the plans, work on the improvements will begin in the Spring next year.

Funding for the work has already been agreed and earmarked by the city council.

Councillor Ann O'Byrne, Liverpool City Council's cabinet member responsible for housing, said: "What these improvements will do is create well maintained green spaces for residents to use, as well as making the streets seem much more open and spacious. But we really want to understand what residents think of our ideas before we finalise them and begin the work in the Spring."
