KEEPING IN TOUCH

Carillion and LFC will be keeping all our stadium neighbours informed throughout the project, this includes any disruptions that may arise during the expansion works. We will regularly provide information ahead of any works that may affect you and will also provide regular updates on work undertaken to minimise the impacts of any disruptions.

As work progresses we will also share good news stories from the project and other useful information.

Liverpool Football Club would like to thank the Anfield community for their support during the pre-planning consultation. The support we received from local community groups, businesses and residents was instrumental in helping us to reach the decision to progress with our planning application to expand the Main Stand.

With the expansion now underway, we are mindful that a lot of work will be carried out in the area and will endeavour to ensure that all works completed on site will be done so whilst considering the impact on our neighbours.

FIRST STEPS

Carillion who are the main contractor, started their first day on site at Anfield as the redevelopment of the Main Stand took its first steps on Monday 8 December

The first activities you may have noticed, is work to ensure the site at Gilman Street and Tinsley Street is safely secured. The timber fences ('hoarding') erected by Liverpool City Council are now managed by Carillion. These hoardings will be extended to ensure the site is fully enclosed.

Carillion will also continue with the traffic management policy put in place by Liverpool City Council, which currently means that access into the site will be from Walton Breck Road, along Tinsley Street. The site exit will be via Anfield Road. You may also see that a temporary 'set-up' (site accommodation and welfare facilities) for Carillion management, supervision and operatives will be delivered and erected on site at Tinsley Street during this time.

With less than three weeks to go until the festive period, the main activities on site will be preparatory works, which means the excavation of the new Main Stand "footprint" and construction of new foundations to support the frame.

MORE ON CARILLION....

For those of you unfamiliar with Carillion, we are currently building the new Royal Liverpool and Broadgreen University Hospital (RLUH), which will be the largest single-bed hospital in the country and will house one of the largest emergency departments in the North West.

At the RLUH site we have adopted industry best practice to ensure disruption to the local community is minimal and here you will see our commitment to site security, traffic management and logistics, local highways and our consideration to local residents. Completion of the Royal Hospital is scheduled for 2017

CONSIDERATE CONSTRUCTORS

The Anfield Stadium expansion project is registered with the Considerate Constructors Scheme (CCS), a national initiative set up by the construction industry to encourage best practice beyond statutory requirements.

Carillion will comply with the scheme's Code of Considerate Practice: **Care About Appearance**; The site will be clean, tidy and well managed. **Respect the Community**; We will consider how our work impacts our neighbours.

USEFUL INFORMATION.....

Core operating hours will be from 7.30am to 6.00pm Monday to Friday.

Carillion have secured a car park licence in Stanley Park to ensure that cars belonging to the workforce are managed and not simply allowed to park in the neighbouring streets.

Weekend working will only be on very limited basis and only by prior agreement with the planning and environmental office who have made their noise thresholds clear in the planning condition consents we have to follow.

To minimise the impact of traffic from deliveries, all deliveries will be managed by a computerised delivery system by our dedicated logistics management team. We will know one week in advance of all times for proposed deliveries. We will be working closely with the team over the next few weeks to develop delivery tracking which will help us to reduce potential disruptions during busy times of the day for e.g. the school run

We will stop work on Tuesday 23 December 2014 and will recommence on Monday 5 January 2015.
